The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

Scripture Reading—Leviticus 16:15-16, 18-19


Then [the high priest] shall kill the goat of the sin offering that is for the people and bring its blood inside the veil and do with its blood as he did with the blood of the bull, sprinkling it over the mercy seat and in front of the mercy seat. Thus he shall make atonement for the Holy Place, because of the uncleannesses of the people of Israel and because of their transgressions, all their sins. And so he shall do for the tent of meeting, which dwells with them in the midst of their uncleannesses.

Then he shall go out to the altar that is before the Lord and make atonement for it, and shall take some of the blood of the bull and some of the blood of the goat, and put it on the horns of the altar all around. And he shall sprinkle some of the blood on it with his finger seven times, and cleanse it and consecrate it from the uncleannesses of the people of Israel.

Reading of the Word—1 John 1:5-2:6


⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say we have fellowship with Him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸ If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰ If we say we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.

^{2:1} My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ² He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. ³ And by this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments. ⁴ Whoever says "I know Him" but does not keep His commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in Him, ⁵ but whoever keeps His word, in him truly the love of God is perfected. By this we may know that we are in Him: ⁶ whoever says He abides in Him ought to walk in the same way in which He walked.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—from Psalm 32:3-6

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. For when we kept silent, our bones wasted away through our groaning all day long. For day and night Your hand was heavy upon us; our strength was dried up as by the heat of summer.

All: We acknowledged our sin to You, and we did not cover our iniquity.

Pastor: Let everyone who is godly offer prayer to You at a time when You may be found.

All: We said, "We will confess our transgressions to the Lord."


Assurance of Pardon—from Psalm 32:1-2, 5; Luke 18:27

You forgave the iniquity of our sin. Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. Blessed is the man against whom the Lord counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

Pastor: This is the promise of God. This is the Word of the Lord.

All: What is impossible with man is possible with God.


angels, the archangels, and the whole company of Heaven in this hymn of eternal praise:


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT

In today's scripture passage, John makes a clear distinction between the way of light and the way of darkness. Light brings clarity. Darkness brings confusion. Light brings life. Darkness brings death. We live in a world that thrives on twisting truth yet fractures at every new ideology and perspective. Man's ways seem right in his own eyes, yet we worship and serve the creature rather than the Creator. Jesus came to rescue us from the convoluted path of darkness. The Light of light has descended. As we confess our sin and walk in obedience, the powers of hell vanish, and the darkness clears away. He opens our eyes to the light that we may see Him, hear Him, trust Him and in Him alone rejoice.
