
### GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

Jesus said, "As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you. Abide in My love. If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love. These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full. "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. You are My friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you. You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in My name, He may give it to you. 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# Reading of the Word—1 John 4:7-21

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
<sup>7</sup>Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent His only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and His love is perfected in us.

<sup>13</sup> By this we know that we abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His Spirit. <sup>14</sup> And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent His Son to be the Savior of the world. <sup>15</sup> Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. <sup>16</sup> So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. <sup>17</sup> By this is love perfected with us, so that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as He is so also are we in this world. <sup>18</sup> There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love. <sup>19</sup> We love because He first loved us. <sup>20</sup> If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. <sup>21</sup> And this commandment we have from Him: whoever loves God must also love his brother.

#### GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

### Confession of Sin—based on Psalm 25:6-7, 11, 18, 22

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. Remember Your mercy and Your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

All: For Your name's sake, O Lord, pardon our guilt, for it is great.

Pastor: Remember not the sins of our youth or our transgressions, for we have not loved You nor have we loved one

another as we ought.

All: According to Your steadfast love remember us, for the sake of Your goodness, O Lord!

Pastor: Consider our affliction and our trouble, and forgive all our sins.

All: Redeem us, O God, out of all our troubles.

# Assurance of Pardon—Psalm 103:8, 10-12; Acts 1:8

The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love... He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is His steadfast love toward those who fear Him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does He remove our transgression from us.

Pastor: This is the promise of God.


All: This is the Word of the Lord.

### Worship Notes:

I'll have to admit, when the task is to find hymns to complement a service focused on the passage "God is love" (1 John 4:8), the difficulty isn't finding suitable material—it's trying to narrow the material down! See if you notice some of the fantastic descriptions of God's love in our hymnody this morning: it is "ineffable," "wondrous," an "immortal flame," and the "love of every love the best." We'll confess that His love is mighty, and yet mightier than it seems. The psalms will remind us that His love endures forever (Psalm 118) and to "trust in nothing but His love" (Psalm 62). But I think my favorite rendering of the love of God that we'll sing this morning is the beloved children's hymn Jesus Loves Me, This I Know. All throughout this sermon series, I've hoped to find a place to use this hymn because it pairs so appropriately with the Apostle John, who often refers to his readers as "little children." The simple yet profound words speak to the hope we have from the Scriptures that Christ died to wash away our sins because He loves us—truths that bring comfort to Christians of any age. —Henry C.
