## GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The People of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

### Confession of Sin—Psalm 32:1-7

Pastor: O Lord, You tell us that blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.

Blessed is the man against whom You count no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

That is why, this morning, we come confessing.

All: For when we kept silent, our bones wasted away through our groaning all day long.

Pastor: For day and night Your hand was heavy upon us; our strength was dried up as by the heat of

summer.

All: So we acknowledge our sin to You, and we do not cover our iniquity.

Pastor: We therefore confess our transgressions to You, O Lord.

All: And You forgive the iniquity of our sin.

Pastor: Therefore we offer prayer to You, while You may be found.

All: You are our hiding place.

Pastor: You preserve us from trouble.

All: You surround me with shouts of deliverance.

### Assurance of Pardon—Lamentations 3:19-23; Matthew 28:19-20

Remember our affliction and our wanderings, O Lord. Remember the wormwood and the gall! But this I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning. Great is Your faithfulness, O Lord, our God.

Pastor: This is the promise of God, our great inheritance from Him.

All: This is the Word of the Lord.

Pastor: Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the

Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all I have commanded you. And behold, I am

with you always, to the end of the age.

All: Thanks be to God, our refuge, our strength, and our redeemer.

## Worship Notes:

As we come to the close of our time in Paul's letters to the Thessalonians, I have been reflecting on some of the common themes of the two books. Over and over, Paul gives words of comfort ("may the Lord of peace Himself give you peace at all times in every way," 2 Thessalonians 2:16) and encouragement ("do not grow weary in doing good," 2 Thessalonians 2:13; "encourage one another and build one another up," 1 Thessalonians 5:11). With those words in mind, I chose the two hymns which close our service this morning: Great Is Thy Faithfulness and There's A Wideness In God's Mercy. Great Is Thy Faithfulness, based on the passage from Lamentations 3 which is used for today's Call to Worship and Assurance of Pardon, encourages us with the "bright hope for tomorrow" we have in the promises of God. The line "there is no place where earth's sorrows are more felt than up in heaven" from There's A Wideness completely captures Paul's sentiment towards these new Christians in Thessalonica. Though sorrows and persecution will come, we can take comfort in our loving Savior, a gentle shepherd who would have us "come and gather at His feet." —Henry C. Haffner
