
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

All: Make known His deeds among the peoples!


Reader 1: Glory in His holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice!

GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH HIS WORD

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

Scripture Reading—John 20:24-31

Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into His side, I will never believe."

Eight days later, His disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then He said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see My hands; and put out your hand, and place it in My side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen Me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name.

I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴ And this is the confidence that we have toward Him, that if we ask anything according to His will He hears us. ¹⁵ And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of Him.


¹⁶ If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not leading to death, he shall ask, and God will give him life—to those who commit sins that do not lead to death. There is sin that leads to death; I do not say that one should pray for that. ¹⁷ All wrongdoing is sin, but there is sin that does not lead to death.

¹⁸We know that everyone who has been born of God does not keep on sinning, but he who was born of God protects him, and the evil one does not touch him. ¹⁹We know that we are from God, and the whole world lies in the power of the evil one. ²⁰And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know Him who is true; and we are in Him who is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life. ²¹Little children, keep yourselves from idols.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—from Ezekiel 14:3-7

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We have taken our idols into our hearts and set the stumbling block of our

iniquity before our faces. Should You indeed let Yourself be consulted by us?

All: We have taken our idols into our heart and set the stumbling block of our iniquity before our

face, and yet we come to the prophet with the multitude of our idols.

Pastor: Have mercy on us, for we are all estranged from You through our idols.

All: We have separated ourselves from You, taking our idols into our heart and putting the stumbling

block of our iniquity before our face.

Pastor: Give us grace to repent and turn away from our idols, and turn away our faces from all our abominations.

Assurance of Pardon—1 John 1:9; Acts 1:8

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Pastor: This is the promise of God.


All: This is the Word of the Lord.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION AND THE LORD'S TABLE


This table is open to all baptized Christians who have made a profession of faith. You may come forward to receive the bread and wine or grape juice.

I know that my redeemer lives, what comfort this sweet sentence gives.—Samuel Medley

This year's two sermon series have been a study in contrasts. After spending three months studying Exodus 20, and finding ourselves coming up woefully short of the law of God, these last two months in 1 John have provided such comfort and security. John writes to his "little children" that they "may know that [they] have eternal life" (1 John 5:13). When our confidence is placed on the Lord, we know that we shall never be moved (*Alleluia! How Blest The Man—Psalm 112*). When we learn to trust in Jesus, we can know that He is with us till the end ('Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus). If we love Him, we know that He is ours (*My Jesus, I Love Thee*). If we ask anything of Him, He hears us (1 John 5:14), giving us the strength to bear the cross of grief or pain (*Be Still, My Soul*). He is a mighty fortress (*A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*) and a stronghold in troubled days (*Fret Not Yourself—Psalm 37*), who makes even His commands a delight. —Henry C. Haffner
