
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

All: The lines have fallen for us in pleasant places; indeed, we have a beautiful inheritance.


Reader 1: I have set the Lord always before me.

GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH HIS WORD

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—from Jeremiah 2:2-3, 5, 11-13, 19

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We remember the kindness of our youth and the love of our betrothal, when we went after You in the wilderness. We were holy to the Lord. But now we have gone far from You, and we

have followed idols and become idolaters. Has a nation changed its gods, which are not gods?

All: But we have changed our glory for what does not profit.

Pastor: Be astonished, O heavens, at this, and be horribly afraid; be very desolate. For we have committed two evils.

All: We have forsaken You, the fountain of living waters, and hewn for ourselves cisterns—broken

cisterns that can hold no water.

Pastor: Our own wickedness has corrected us, and our backslidings have rebuked us.

All: We know and see that it is an evil and bitter thing that we have forsaken the Lord our God.


Assurance of Pardon—1 John 2:1-2; Luke 18:27


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT

Worship Notes:

The Scripture passages we read this morning, as well as the psalms and hymns we sing, point to the living Jesus Christ as the source of all life. We are called into worship by Psalm 16, declaring that the Lord "make[s] known to us the path of life." We respond with two exuberant psalms that thank God for His life-giving provision (Hallelujah, Praise Jehovah—Psalm146; The King In Your Strength Shall Be Glad—Psalm 21). Throughout the service, we hear that Jesus' life is the light of men (John 1:3), that He is "light's living spring" (O Splendor Of God's Glory Bright), the "Word of Life" (1 John 1:1), and the source of all life— of "things that are, that have been, and that future years shall see" (Of The Father's Love Begotten). Having been invited to fellowship (1 John 1:3) at the table, we pray in song that we would all receive Jesus' life (Love Divine, All Loves Excelling), and confess that our lives now "flow in endless song" because He is Lord (How Can I Keep From Singing). And just as the text from 1 John concludes by giving his reason for writing of our living Savior ("that your joy may be complete"), our service also concludes with joy. Since Jesus is our "life and health and peace" (O For A Thousand Tongues To Sing), we can go out leaping for joy. —Henry C. Haffner
