
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

Reader 1: The Lord is our chosen portion and our cup; You hold our lot.


Reader 2: The lines have fallen for us in pleasant places; indeed, we have a beautiful inheritance.

All: Thanks be to God.



GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—based on Isaiah 55:8: Exodus 20:1-17

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We acknowledge that our thoughts are not Your thoughts, neither are our ways Your ways. You spoke all these words, saying, "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

All: "You shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not make for yourself a carved image. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy."

Pastor: Your law pierces our heart. Lord, have mercy.

All: "Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal."

Pastor: Your law pierces our heart and drives us to Christ. Lord, have mercy.

All: "You shall not bear false witness. You shall not covet."

Pastor: Your law pierces our heart and drives us to Christ. Lord, have mercy upon us, for we are foolish, poor, and rebellious sinners in need of Your grace, Your favor, and Your love.


Assurance of Pardon—1 Thessalonians 5:23-24; Mark 12:30

People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Worship Notes:

This morning's service speaks to contentment: our lack of it, and God's infinite ability to supply our deficiencies. Having been called into worship with Psalm 16, which tells us that "the Lord is our chosen portion," we respond with Come, Thou Fount Of Every Blessing, admitting that we are quick to wander after the things of this world. In May The Mind Of Christ, My Savior, we pray that the peace of God would rule our lives, so that we might be "calm to comfort [the] sick and sorrowing." When greed, envy, or doubt rise up, If Thou But Suffer God To Guide Thee urges us to be patient, taking whatever our Father sends us with "cheerful hope and heart content." Fret Not Yourself (Psalm 37) reminds us to "be still before the Lord and wait" when trials and difficulties come, while in Calm Content we declare our desire to "learn to be content with when and where" He leads. As we head out into a discontented, turbulent world this week, I pray that this service would help us to rest in the supply of our Savior's flowing wounds—a Savior who shed His blood for dying thieves like us. —Henry C. Haffner
