
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

All: His praise shall continually be in our mouths.


Reader 1: We will make our boast in the Lord. Surely, we will trust in Him.

GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH HIS WORD

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.


Scripture Reading—Psalm 133:1-3

Reading of the Word—Philemon 1:10-25

¹⁰ I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I became in my imprisonment. ¹¹ (Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful to you and to me.) ¹² I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. ¹³ I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, ¹⁴ but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own accord. ¹⁵ For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, ¹⁶ no longer as a bondservant but more than a bondservant, as a beloved brother—especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

¹⁷So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me. ¹⁸ If he has wronged you at all, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. ¹⁹ I, Paul, write this with my own hand: I will repay it—to say nothing of your owing me even your own self. ²⁰ Yes, brother, I want some benefit from you in the Lord. Refresh my heart in Christ.

²¹Confident of your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say. ²² At the same time, prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping that through your prayers I will be graciously given to you.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—James 4:4; Romans 3:22-26

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We know that friendship with the world is enmity with God. We know that whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.

All: For there is no distinction: all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified only by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.

Pastor: God put Jesus forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith.

All: This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins.

Pastor: It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be both the just and the justifier.

All: And thus, He has completely redeemed the one who has faith in Jesus.

Assurance of Pardon—Psalm 85:8-12; Romans 3:23-24

Let us hear what God the Lord will speak, for He will speak peace to His people, to His saints; surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him, that glory may dwell in the land. Steadfast love and faithfulness meet; righteousness and peace kiss each other. Faithfulness springs up from the ground, and righteousness looks down from the sky. Yes, the Lord will give what is good.

Pastor: This is the promise of God.


All: This is the Word of the Lord.






Words of Institution and the Lord's Table


This table is open to all baptized Christians who have made a profession of faith. You may come forward to receive the bread and wine or grape juice.



Worship Notes:

Many of the hymns we sing this morning focus on God's providence. The service is bookended by verses from O Worship The King, a paraphrase of Psalm 104, which speaks of God's kingly majesty and His "bountiful care." In Jesus, Shepherd Of Thy People, we declare that we "trust [His] mighty hand," while in The Lord I Will At All Times Bless—Psalm 34, we proclaim our confidence that God will deliver us from all our troubles. O Put Your Trust In God warns us to "leave to His sovereign sway to choose and to command," while Fret Not Yourself—Psalm 37 urges us to "be still before the Lord and wait," because He is a sure stronghold and upholds us with His hand. God's providential orchestration of events doesn't always look like what we would expect—just look at the story of Onesimus. If the Lord can transform a deceitful slave into a loyal brother, what unlikely outcomes might He bring to pass in our lives?
