
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

All: Praise the Lord! We will give thanks to the Lord with our whole hearts.



GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH HIS WORD

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.


Reading of the Word—Hebrews 6:13-20

For when God made a promise to Abraham, since He had no one greater by whom to swear, He swore by Himself, ¹⁴ saying, "Surely I will bless you and multiply you." ¹⁵ And thus Abraham, having patiently waited, obtained the promise. ¹⁶ For people swear by something greater than themselves, and in all their disputes an oath is final for confirmation. ¹⁷ So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of His purpose, He guaranteed it with an oath, ¹⁸ so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us. ¹⁹ We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, ²⁰ where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin-based on Nehemiah 1:5-11

Pastor: O Lord God of heaven, You are the great and awesome God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with Your

people. Therefore, let Your ear be attentive and Your eyes open, to hear our confession that we pray before

You now.

All: We Your people have sinned against You.

Pastor: We have not kept the commandments and statutes that You gave us.

All: Yet we are the people whom You have redeemed by Your great power and by Your strong hand.

Pastor: Hear, O Lord, the prayer of Your servants who would delight to fear Your name.

All: Make us walk in faithfulness, bearing witness across the generations.

Assurance of Pardon—2 Peter 1:3-4; Titus 2:11-14

His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us to His own glory and excellence, by which He has granted to us His precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire.

All: This is the Word of the Lord.


Pastor: For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and

People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION AND THE LORD'S TABLE


This table is open to all baptized Christians who have made a profession of faith. You may come forward to receive the bread and wine or grape juice.

His oath, His covenant, His blood support me in the whelming flood...

This morning's service points us to the enduring reality of God's covenant and urges us to rest upon these precious promises. In the gospel invitation, the Lord Himself states that "My covenant of peace shall not be removed" (Isaiah 54:10). The God Of Abraham Praise declares that we "on His oath depend," and All Nations Clap Your Hands—Psalm 47 reminds us that promises made to Abraham are for us as well ("The heirs of gentile thrones as Abram's children meet," Psalm 47:9). We'll sing in various places that the Lord has promised good to us (Amazing Grace), that His promised grace is sure (O Put Your Trust In God), that He promises rest to the weary (Gently, Gently Lay Your Rod—Psalm 6), and that we hope in His faithfulness (Great Is Thy Faithfulness). And just as the text from Hebrews describes our hope in Jesus as a "sure and steadfast anchor of the soul" (Hebrews 6:19), we will go out singing that "in every high and stormy gale, my anchor holds within the veil" (My Hope Is Built On Nothing Less). —Henry C. Haffner
