
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP


Scripture Reading—Galatians 4:1-7




Reading of the Word—Hebrews 12:3-11

³Consider Him who endured from sinners such hostility against Himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. ⁴In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. ⁵And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by Him. ⁶For the Lord disciplines the one He loves, and chastises every son whom He receives."

⁷ It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? ⁸ If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. ⁹ Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰ For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but He disciplines us for our good, that we may share His holiness. ¹¹ For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Sermon—God's Gift of Discipline

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin

- Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death (Proverbs 14:12). The soul who sins shall die (Ezekiel 18:20), for the wages of sin is death (Romans 6:23).
- All: We have all sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23).
- Pastor: There is none righteous, not even one; there is none who understands, there is none who seeks for God (Romans 3:10-11).
- All: All of us have turned aside; together we have become useless (Romans 3:12).
- Pastor: And all those who hate God, love death (Proverbs 8:36).
- All: Lord, we believe. Help us in our unbelief (Mark 9:24).

Assurance of Pardon—1 John 1:5-9; Luke 18:27

This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with Him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Pastor: This is the promise of God. This is the Word of the Lord.

All: What is impossible with man is possible with God.



WORDS OF INSTITUTION AND THE LORD'S TABLE


This table is open to all baptized Christians who have made a profession of faith. You may come forward to receive the bread and wine or grape juice.
