
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH HIS WORD

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

Scripture Reading—Hosea 2:16-20

In that day, declares the Lord, you will call Me 'My Husband,' and no longer will you call Me 'My Baal.' For I will remove the names of the Baals from her mouth, and they shall be remembered by name no more. And I will make for them a covenant on that day with the beasts of the field, the birds of the heavens, and the creeping things of the ground. And I will abolish the bow, the sword, and war from the land, and I will make you lie down in safety. And I will betroth you to Me forever. I will betroth you to Me in righteousness and in justice, in steadfast love and in mercy. I will betroth you to Me in faithfulness. And you shall know the Lord.

Reading of the Word—2 Corinthians 11:1-15

I wish you would bear with me in a little foolishness. Do bear with me! ² For I feel a divine jealousy for you, since I betrothed you to one husband, to present you as a pure virgin to Christ. ³ But I am afraid that as the serpent deceived Eve by his cunning, your thoughts will be led astray from a sincere and pure devotion to Christ. ⁴ For if someone comes and proclaims another Jesus than the one we proclaimed, or if you receive a different spirit from the one you received, or if you accept a different gospel from the one you accepted, you put up with it readily enough. ⁵ Indeed, I consider that I am not in the least inferior to these super-apostles. ⁶ Even if I am unskilled in speaking, I am not so in knowledge; indeed, in every way we have made this plain to you in all things.


⁷Or did I commit a sin in humbling myself so that you might be exalted, because I preached God's gospel to you free of charge? ⁸I robbed other churches by accepting support from them in order to serve you. ⁹And when I was with you and was in need, I did not burden anyone, for the brothers who came from Macedonia supplied my need. So I refrained and will refrain from burdening you in any way. ¹⁰As the truth of Christ is in me, this boasting of mine will not be silenced in the regions of Achaia. ¹¹And why? Because I do not love you? God knows I do!

¹² And what I am doing I will continue to do, in order to undermine the claim of those who would like to claim that in their boasted mission they work on the same terms as we do. ¹³ For such men are false apostles, deceitful workmen, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. ¹⁴ And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. ¹⁵ So it is no surprise if his servants, also, disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will correspond to their deeds.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—based on Hosea 2:5-7, 13

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. You punish us for the feast days of the Baals when we burned offerings to them and adorned ourselves with our rings and jewelry and went after our lovers and forgot You.

All: For we said, 'I will go after my lovers, who give me bread and my water, my wool and my flax, my oil and my drink.'

Pastor: Therefore, You hedged up our way with thorns, and You built a wall against us, so that we could not find our paths.

All: So now we say, 'I will go and return to my first husband, for it was better for me then than now.'

Assurance of Pardon—Hosea 2:14-15; Acts 1:8


Pastor: This is the promise of God.




GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT

Announcements

Worship Notes:

At the beginning of 2 Corinthians 11, Paul expresses his zeal for the purity of the church by comparing her to Eve in the garden. Just as our first mother was deceived by the serpent, so the Corinthian believers are being deceived by false teachers. Many of this morning's readings and hymns explore images of marital fidelity as metaphors for the church's call to holiness. The Call to Worship from Psalm 45 describes a royal marriage feast (in the explanatory text at the beginning of the psalm, it is called "a Love song"). We'll also read several times from the book of Hosea, in which the prophet is married to an unfaithful wife. The church is called a "holy bride" sought by Jesus in *The Church's One Foundation*, and again a "bride" that is holy and free from bondage in *From Babel To Zion. Holy, Holy, Holy* and *Before The Throne Of God* ascribe holiness to God—the Trinity is "perfect in power, in love, and purity;" the "risen Lamb" is perfect and spotless—while *At The Name Of Jesus* encourages us to ask Him to "subdue all that is not holy" in our hearts. Though Paul begins the chapter with concern for bridal purity, he concludes with a stirring condemnation of those who would violate or deceive: "Their end will correspond to their deeds." Thus, the service concludes with *I Know That My Redeemer Lives*, with its rousing declaration that Jesus will "crush the fiends of hell," and a benediction from Romans 16, which reminds us that He will "crush Satan under your feet"—just as He promised in the garden.
