
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

Reading of the Word-2 Timothy 1:8-18


⁸Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, ⁹ who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of His own purpose and grace, which He gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ and which now has been manifested through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel, ¹¹ for which I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, ¹² which is why I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that He is able to guard until that day what has been entrusted to me. ¹³ Follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ By the Holy Spirit who dwells within us, guard the good deposit entrusted to you.

¹⁵You are aware that all who are in Asia turned away from me, among whom are Phygelus and Hermogenes. ¹⁶May the Lord grant mercy to the household of Onesiphorus, for he often refreshed me and was not ashamed of my chains, ¹⁷ but when he arrived in Rome he searched for me earnestly and found me— ¹⁸ may the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day!—and you well know all the service he rendered at Ephesus.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin-based on James 4:4; Romans 3:22-26

- Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We know that friendship with the world is enmity with God. We know that whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.
- All: For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.
- Pastor: God put Jesus forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith.
- All: This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins.

Pastor: It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be both the just and the justifier.

All: He has completely redeemed the one who has faith in Jesus.

Assurance of Pardon—from Psalm 85:8-12; Romans 1:16-17

Let us hear what God the Lord will speak, for He will speak peace to His people, to His saints... Surely His salvation is near to those who fear Him, that glory may dwell in the land. Steadfast love and faithfulness meet; righteousness and peace kiss each other. Faithfulness springs up from the ground, and righteousness looks down from the sky. Yes, the Lord will give what is good.

Pastor: This is the promise of God.

All: This is the Word of the Lord.

Pastor: Therefore, I am not ashamed of the Gospel.

- All: It is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes.
- Pastor: For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

Worship Notes:

If last week's sermon text presented Paul reminiscing about the past, this week's passage finds the Apostle looking to the future, confident that Christ will lead him in the way he should go. He urges Timothy to follow in the path set before him (vs. 13), the "holy calling" that the Lord has placed on his life (vs. 9). As we sing this morning, we echo Paul's imperative. We declare that our God will be our guide until death (*Within Your Temple Lord—Psalm 48*). We ask Him to lead us through desert lands and onto a rock where we might rest from trouble (*Jesus, Shepherd Of Thy People; Lord, Hear My Voice—Psalm 61*). We seek Him for strength to run the race set before us (*May The Mind Of Christ My Savior*). Like Paul, we boldly state our intent to proclaim God's works to sinners and saints alike (*I Waited Patient For The Lord—Psalm 40*), and trust that we will not be put to shame in our labors (*To Live Is Christ*). Though sin's wars may be fierce, we can say boldly that we follow our Lord without fear (*Lead On, O King Eternal*). His grace will make us strong. —Henry C. Haffner
