
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

Scripture Reading—Philippians 3:7-17

But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For His sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith—that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and may share His sufferings, becoming like Him in His death, that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me His own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. Let those of us who are mature think this way, and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal that also to you. Only let us hold true to what we have attained. Brothers, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us.


Reading of the Word—Hebrews 6:1-12

Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, ² and of instruction about washings, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. ³ And this we will do if God permits. ⁴ For it is impossible, in the case of those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, and have shared in the Holy Spirit, ⁵ and have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the age to come, ⁶ and then have fallen away, to restore them again to repentance, since they are crucifying once again the Son of God to their own harm and holding Him up to contempt. ⁷ For land that has drunk the rain that often falls on it, and produces a crop useful to those for whose sake it is cultivated, receives a blessing from God. ⁸ But if it bears thorns and thistles, it is worthless and near to being cursed, and its end is to be burned.

⁹Though we speak in this way, yet in your case, beloved, we feel sure of better things—things that belong to salvation.¹⁰For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the love that you have shown for His name in serving the saints, as you still do. ¹¹And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end, ¹² so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.

Confession of Sin-based on Psalm 130:1-4, 7-8

- Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. Out of the depths we cry to You, O Lord! Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of our pleas for mercy!
- All: If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, who could stand?
- Pastor: But with You there is forgiveness, that You may be feared.
- All: For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with Him is plentiful redemption.
- Pastor: O Israel, hope in the Lord!
- All: For He will redeem Israel from all our iniquities.


Assurance of Pardon—Titus 3:4-7; Titus 2:11-14

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

People: And also with you.


Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

Worship Notes:

Faced with a stern warning against apostasy in the sermon text from Hebrews 6, the elements in this morning's service were chosen to highlight our own natural tendency to "fall away" (Hebrews 6:6) and God's promise to grant us perseverance. In our opening hymn, we confess that we are "prone to wander" even from the love of our gracious God (*Come Thou Fount Of Every Blessing*). Passages from the Psalms remind us that the Lord has not let our foot slip (Psalm 66) and that He promises to keep our pathway straight (*Fret Not Yourself—Psalm 37*). We'll ask Him to equip us to run the race set before us (*May The Mind Of Christ My Savior*) and to keep us from falling to pride (*The Wicked Man Fears Not The Lord—Psalm 36*), and we'll encourage one another to "keep His ways unswerving" (*If Thou But Suffer God To Guide Thee*) and to press on toward the goal (*I Will Lift My Voice—Psalm 101*). The benediction from Jude sends us out with hope, describing our Lord as "Him who is able to keep you from stumbling"—a glorious promise and one we all surely need. —Henry C. Haffner
