
Reading of the Word—Romans 8:1-4

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—based on Isaiah 55:8; Exodus 20:1-17

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We acknowledge that our thoughts are not Your thoughts, neither are our ways Your ways. You spoke all these words, saying, "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

All: "You shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not make for yourself a carved image. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy."

Pastor: Your law pierces our heart. Lord, have mercy.

All: "Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal."

Pastor: Your law pierces our heart and drives us to Christ. Lord, have mercy.

All: "You shall not bear false witness. You shall not covet."

Pastor: Your law pierces our heart and drives us to Christ. Lord, have mercy upon us, for we are foolish, poor, and rebellious sinners in need of Your grace, Your favor, and Your love.


Assurance of Pardon—Galatians 3:13-14; Mark 12:30

People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Worship Notes:

While we have been on a journey through the Ten Commandments since January, our companion for the last five weeks of this series has been Lord, Hear My Voice, a new setting of Psalm 61. This Davidic psalm was possibly written while the king was fleeing from his son Absalom's rebellion (see 2 Samuel 15-19). Like the Israelites wandering in the Sinai desert, David felt lost in the wilderness (he calls "from earth's remotest bound," Psalm 61:2) and was acutely aware of his own inadequacy. Just as the Israelites needed a mediator to even speak to God (Exodus 20:19), David recognizes his need for something greater than himself to rectify his situation, a "rock higher than I" (Psalm 61:2-3). Aren't we in the same position? When faced with the totality of God's Law, we know that we fall woefully short. We break every commandment daily. So let's make David's prayer our own. We cry for the Lord to "lead us to the rock" the rock of Christ Jesus. Jesus is the tower of our defense. Because of Christ, we can know with confidence that the Lord hears us (Psalm 61:5), and we can end our journey through the law by offering daily praises to His name (Psalm 61:8).
