GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP


It is God Himself who calls His people to worship. We do not call ourselves, but it is the King who opens His gates and beckons us into His courts.

Scripture Reading—Hebrews 2:5-9

For it was not to angels that God subjected the world to come, of which we are speaking. It has been testified somewhere, "What is man, that You are mindful of him, or the son of man, that You care for him? You made Him for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned Him with glory and honor, putting everything in subjection under His feet." Now in putting everything in subjection to Him, He left nothing outside His control. At present, we do not yet see everything in subjection to Him. But we see Him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone.



Reading of the Word—Psalm 8:1-9

O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth! You have set Your glory above the heavens. ² Out of the mouth of babies and infants, You have established strength because of Your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.³ When I look at Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars, which You have set in place,⁴ what is man that You are mindful of him, and the son of man that You care for him? ⁵ Yet You have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. ⁶ You have given him dominion over the works of Your hands; You have put all things under his feet, ⁷ all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, ⁸ the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas. ⁹ O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth!

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin-from Romans 1:19-23, Luke 18:13

- Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. What can be known about You is plain to us because You have shown it to us.
- All: Your invisible attributes have been clearly perceived ever since the creation of the world in the things that You have made.

Pastor: We have known You, but we have not honored You as God or given thanks to You.

- All: We have become futile in our thinking, and our foolish hearts have been darkened.
- Pastor: We claim to be wise, but we are fools.
- All: We have exchanged Your glory for images, resembling men and birds and animals, and creeping things.

Pastor: This is the promise of God.


All: This is the Word of the Lord.

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People: And also with you.


Pastor: Lift up your hearts.


