
#### GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

#### All: Hosanna! Hosanna in the highest!


Reader 3: He shall speak peace to the nations; His rule shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.


# Scripture Reading—Luke 19:29-30; 35-42

When [Jesus] drew near to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount that is called Olivet, He sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village in front of you, where on entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat. Untie it and bring it here... And they brought it to Jesus, and throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. And as He rode along, they spread their cloaks on the road. As He was drawing near—already on the way down the Mount of Olives—the whole multitude of His disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" And some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out." Pastor: And, like the Psalmist we cry:


All: "Have mercy upon us, O God, according to Your lovingkindness; according to the multitude of Your tender mercies, blot out our transgressions."


#### Assurance of Pardon—Jonah 4:2; Isaiah 55:10-11; Luke 18:27

People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

angels, the archangels, and the whole company of Heaven in this hymn of eternal praise:



This table is open to all baptized Christians who have made a profession of faith. You may come forward to receive the bread and wine or grape juice.



Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread.
