All: The Lord, strong and mighty, the Lord, mighty in battle!



All: Thus, Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live."


Elder: God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by His power.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The People of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin-based on John 20:24-29; Mark 9:24; Isaiah 1:4

Pastor: Lord, we confess that like the women at the tomb (and later, even some of Christ's disciples), whatever faith we may have, is bedeviled by fear and doubt. Thus, when the other disciples told Thomas, "We have seen the Lord," he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into His side, I will never believe."

All: So, with the faithful through the ages we cry, "Lord, we believe. Help us in our unbelief."

Pastor: Lord, we confess that we are a sinful people, laden with iniquity.

All: We are sinners and the offspring of sinners. We are doubters, as foolish as children.


Assurance of Pardon—based on John 20:26-29; Psalm 145:13-14, 20; Luke 18:27

But Jesus came and stood among His doubting disciples and said, "Peace be with you." He said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see My hands; and put out your hand, and place it in My side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen Me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." Indeed, the Lord is always faithful in all His words and kind in all His works. The Lord upholds all who fall and raises up all who are bowed down. The Lord is righteous in all His ways and kind in all His works.

About the music:

"O Tell Me No More" was written by the English Moravian pastor John Gambold in 1742. The plaintive longing for a heavenly country and quiet confidence in Christ's victory over death appealed to the American compilers of the hymnals *The Southern Harmony* and *The Sacred Harp*, where it was set to the shape-note tune SWEET HARMONY. Earlier this year, the Parish choir had begun working on this piece in preparation for our Good Friday service—the poetry seemed tailor made for a day when we simultaneously mourn Jesus' suffering on the cross and celebrate the promise of eternal life His suffering won for us. Of course, in God's providence, the events of the pandemic intervened and the choir was unable to sing together this season. Short of that, I still wanted to share the hymn with you—you'll hear it today with music composed just last year, which better suits a small group of musicians. As we reflect on this most unusual of Easter Sundays, I pray that this hymn will remind us that Christ is even now sitting on His throne in glory, and that He will not leave us behind. —Henry C. Haffner


GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT

The very first promise of redemption comes immediately after the Fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden. There God declares that the "seed of the woman" would "bruise the head of the serpent" (Genesis 3:16). In the earliest churches, this great promise was artistically represented by mosaics of dragons on floors—upon which everyone in the congregation could step and jump and stomp.
