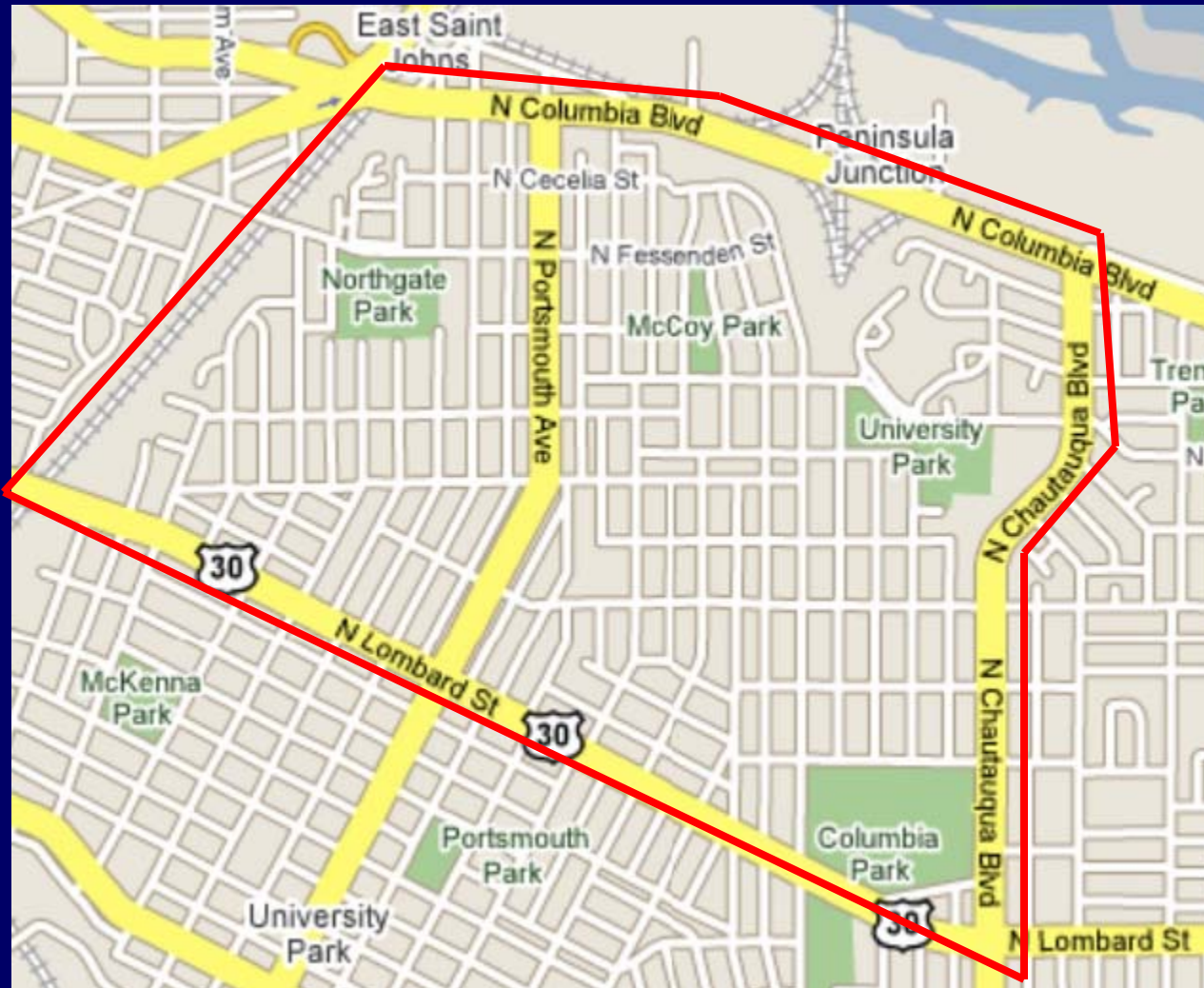

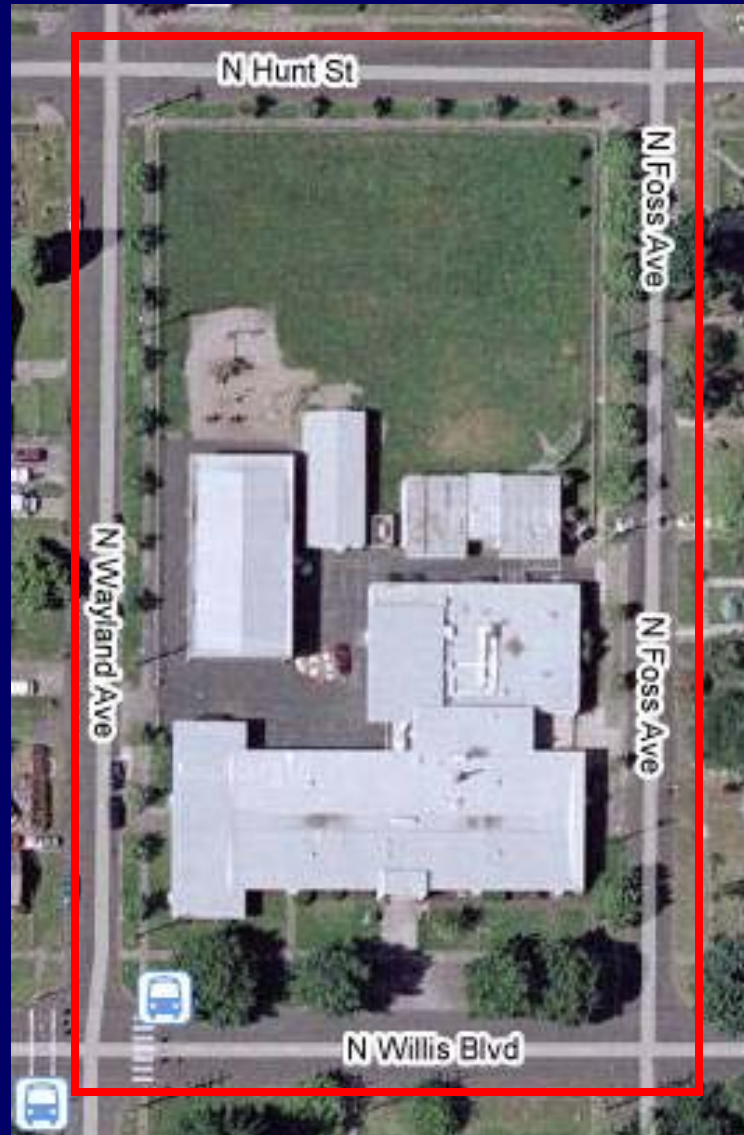

Current Issues

- Portland Hope Meadows
 - Proposed location at the former John Ball School on Wills and Foss
 - Subsidized housing for 8 foster families (maximum of 32 foster children)
 - Subsidized housing for “foster grandparents”
 - Modeled after a Illinois facility that is much bigger

Current Issues Cont'd

- Sharff Military base closure
 - Base is closing in 2011
 - The Dept. of Defense tasked the City of Portland with proposing the best use for the site
 - The site must be considered for housing that will relieve homelessness
 - Other possibilities: affordable housing, church expansion, PDOT site, market rate housing

Current Issues Cont'd

- Land Variance Requests
 - Establishing a strategy to deal with land use variance requests
 - Examples of variances
 - Replace 1 house with 2 small houses
 - Build houses with less than a 5 foot margin to property line
 - Flag lots
 - Attend hearings and file objections
 - Work with the newly created North Portland Land Use Committee

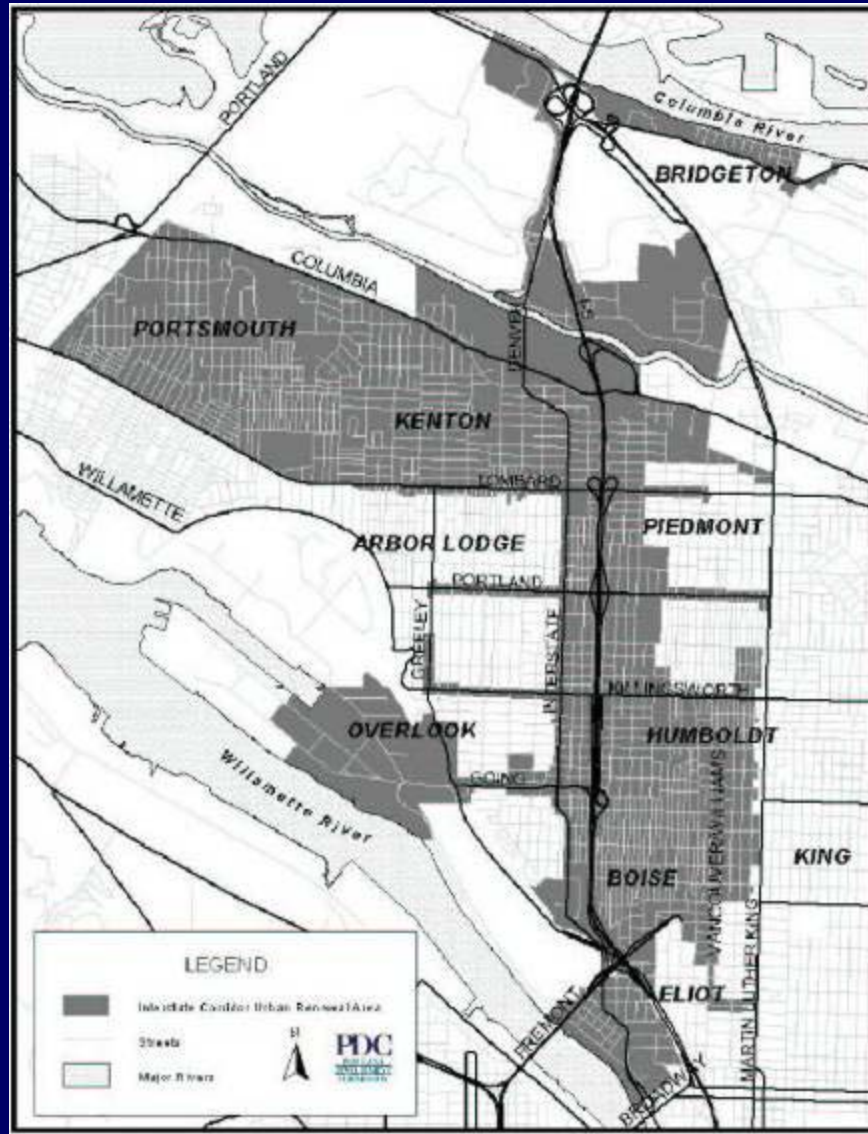

Current Issues Cont'd

- ICURAC (Interstate Corridor Urban Renewal Advisory Committee)
 - Portland Development Commission plans to invest \$335 million from 2000 through 2021 in 10 neighborhoods including Portsmouth
 - Advise the city on the needs for our community
 - Affordable housing
 - Parks
 - Community Centers
