DRESS CODES-KIDS CLASSES

A dress code teaches students discipline, helping with overall focus and energy. By "dressing the part," dancers feel like dancers. Dress codes can also create unity among the dancers instead of causing a few dancers to stand out, much like a school uniform policy. Dress codes go a long way in minimizing distractions, and help give classes a unified look.

LATIN MIX

Black Bottoms (pants, leggings, skirt, etc)

Tops: Red (preferably) White, or Black

Shoes: Smooth Sole, Little to No Tread

BALLET

Black Leotard (short, long-sleeved or both)

Red Wrap Skirt (you may purchase these at any dance supply store or we sell these at the studio, must order \$15- will be available to pick up the next class, if you would like to order a skirt, please contact us)

Pink Ballet Tights

Black (preferred) or Pink Ballet Shoes (Split-sole- we can order these for you, cost: \$15. pick up available the next class)

Hair: Must be pulled back away from face)

ZUMBA

Any Active Wear

Shoes: Athletic with little to no tread)

HIP HOP

Black Jazz Pants, Sweats, or Jeans

Red Tank/Top/T-Shirt or mixed Red, White & Black T-Shirt (Layers and Hoodies are fine)

Black Jazz or Dance Sneakers, or street sneaker with little to no tread to prevent floor scuff marks
