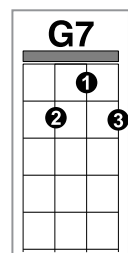
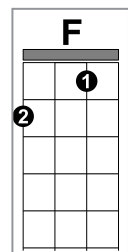
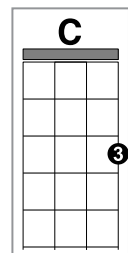
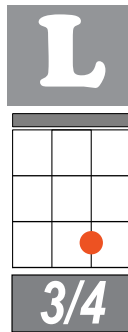
And they all get put in boxes, little boxes just the same.
