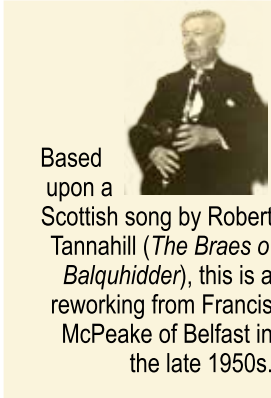


Wild Mountain Thyme

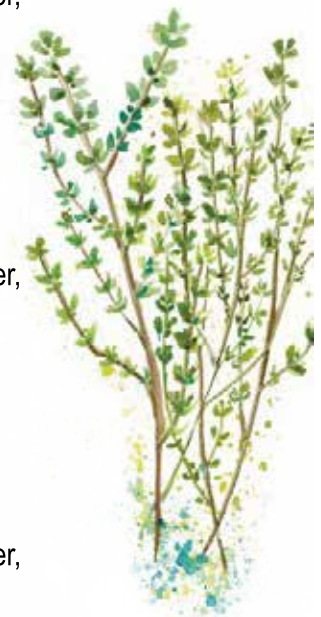
