

<p>Pupil Premium Funding</p> <p>The Government allocates funding to schools to support raising attainment for specific groups of children. These groups include children who are eligible for free school meals, children in care and children who have a parent working in the armed forces. School and Governors work in partnership to carefully plan how we allocate this funding according to the needs of our children. Below is the school's plan for the financial year, this will be reviewed and updated by the Governing Body and impact will be measured at the end of actions.</p>

Milk Scheme to provide free milk to all children.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Milk scheme has been successful in the school and ensures, in addition to the fruit for KS1, pupils are nourished throughout the day • To measure the success of this moving forward will require seeking pupils views and monitoring the take up of the offer
Safeguarding Officer employed by the school.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increased capacity for the Leadership team to undertake their monitoring activities and ensure standards rise • Quicker access to support for parents who require it – parental evaluation and feedback will be sought; the numbers of families receiving support can be monitored • Increased opportunities for pupils to engage in activities to demonstrate they know how to keep themselves safe such as anti-bullying week and e-safety days – this will be measured through pupil and parent surveys
