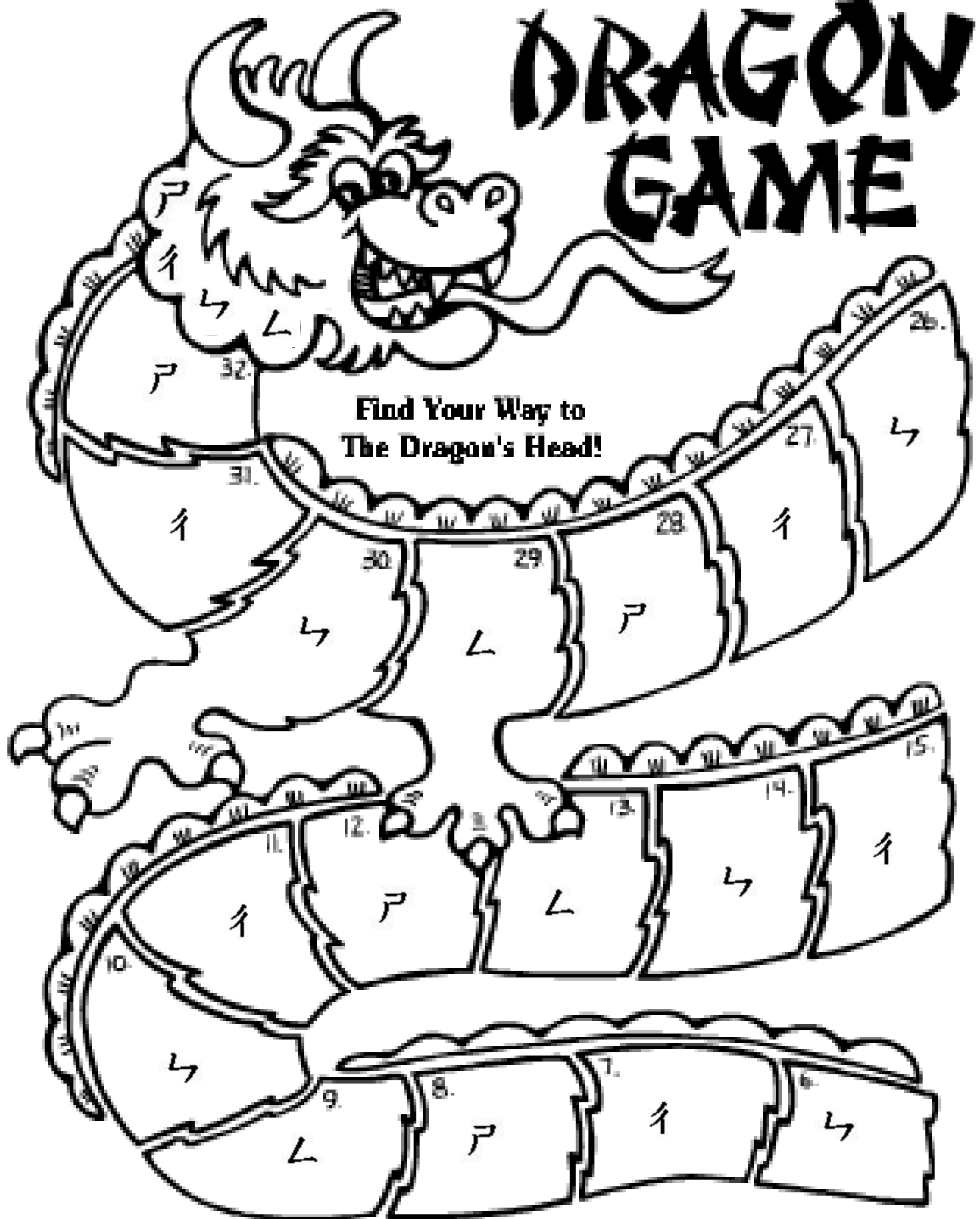
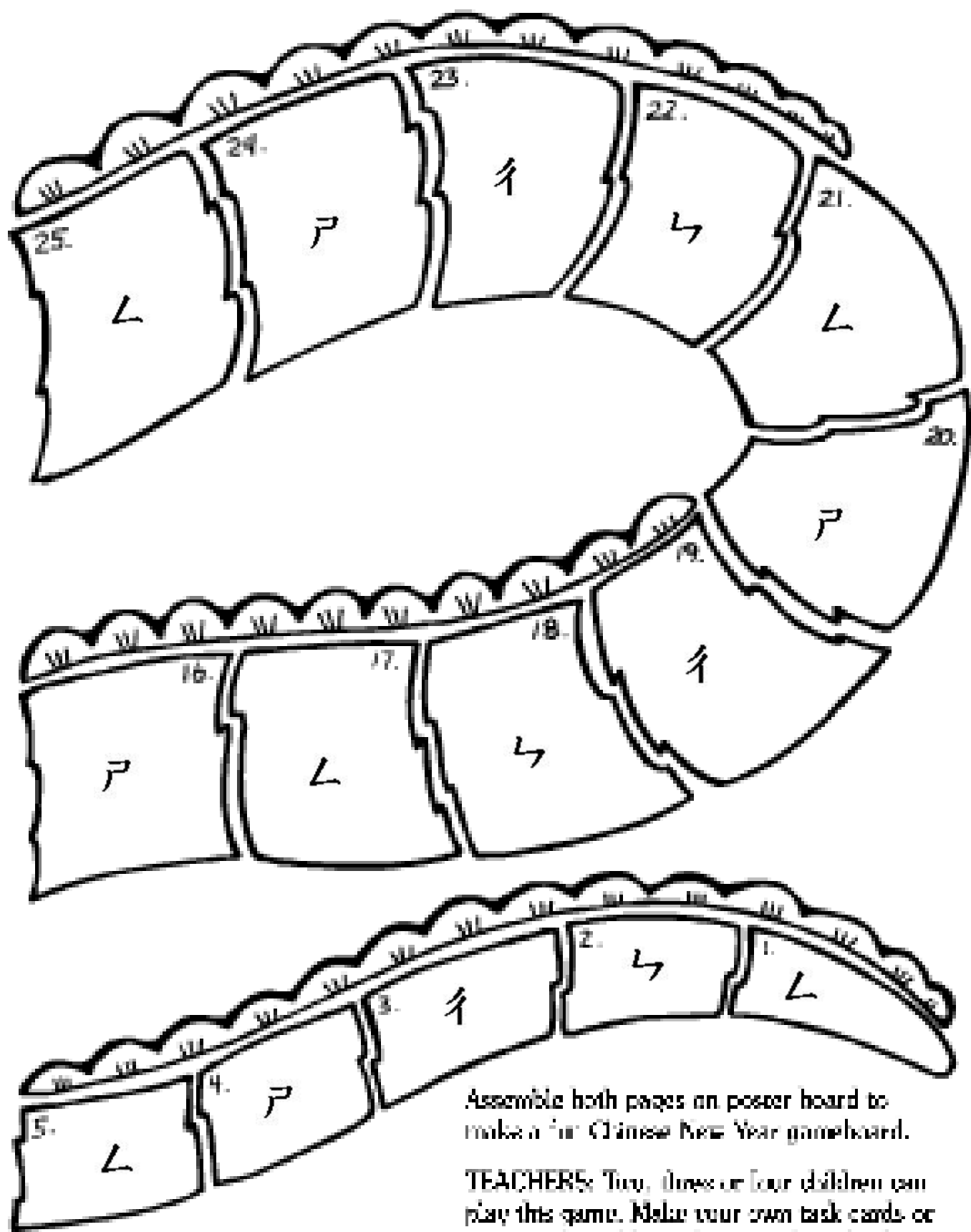


# DRAGON GAME





Assemble both pages on poster board to make a fun Chinese New Year gameboard.

**TEACHERS:** Two, three or four children can play this game. Make your own task cards or write math problems that must be solved on each dragon section.

Directions: Cut out the sound cards on pages 3 and 4. These are the sounds we are studying this week (ㄟ, ㄟ, ㄥ, ㄣ). Shuffle the cards and lay them face down in a pile. The player picks a card and moves his/her piece to the sound used in the word.

Note: Challenge the player to say the sound before moving his/her piece on the board. If that's too easy, ask the player to think of a Chinese word that has that sound in it (this may be easier for ㄟ and ㄟ than for ㄥ and ㄣ because ㄟ and ㄟ begin words whereas ㄥ and ㄣ typically end words).

Remember to make it fun and interesting. If a child is not ready to memorize and say the sounds, ask them to trace the sound on a piece of paper with their finger while they say it a few times. Repeat the sound often for the new player.
