

## Type 2 Wardrobe Refashion



If you know you are a Type 2, or you are experimenting, one of the first things you're going to start doing is evaluating the clothes in your closet and seeing what works, what needs to be put in storage (don't throw it out right away!), what you need to buy, and what could be modified! This guide is about how to modify your wardrobe, so you can get the most out of what you already have. Mostly how to change color, but also design lines.

**No black:** Put your black clothes away in storage for now, until you are pretty sure you're Type 2.

**No White:** you may want to dye your whites with Rit Pearl Grey dye.

**Color palette:** Use the [ColorRit Formula Guide](#) to choose greyed tones of colors to redye some of your lighter clothing. Or dye items with [Rit Pearl Grey](#), to tone down colors. You can also buy all kinds of women's clothing items in white and then dye them in your palette colors, by visiting [Dharma Trading](#).

**Shoes:** [Update your shoes](#) with designs that add femininity, such as with ruffles or bows. Or [spray paint](#) the a gray or silver tone.



## RIT DYE FORMULAS



**Pink:** 116 (1/2 Tsp Petal Pink, 1/4 Tsp Taupe, 1 Cup Water)

**Cool Red:** 133 (1 Tbs Fuchsia, 1 Tsp Violet, 1 Tsp Dark Brown, 1 Cup Water)

493 1 Tbs Wine, 1 Tsp Tangerine, 1 Cup Water

**Toned Green** 227: 1 Tsp Teal, 1 Tsp Kelly Green. 1 Cup Water

Red-Violet: 431, 354, 169, 389, 430 (too many to list)

**Purple:** 525 (1/2 Tsp Navy Blue, 1/8 Tsp Wine, 1 Cup Water)

Blue-Violet: 164, 212, 184, 178, 435, 391 (too many to list)

**Blue:** 438 (1 Tbs Royal Blue, 1 Tsp Black, 1 Cup Water)

173 (1 Tsp Denim Blue, 1/4 Tsp Taupe, 1 Cup Water)

Add Pearl Grey to mute any color

You can dye items just to correct their chroma or to make patterns.

Try Soft Tie Dye

### Upcycling and Reconstructing


How to change garments you already have.

You can use gold or silver foil or paint pens to change the metals on jewelry or buttons.

### Replacing Buttons

You may want to change any buttons or hardware on your blouses, jackets and purses, to your season's metals or palette. You can paint buttons with nail polish to change them.

### Changing Colors of Jewelry and Metals

If you own or find a piece of costume jewelry that you like, but the metal is the wrong color, or perhaps the beads or stones as well, you can try changing that with nail polish or acrylic paint!

#### METALS BY SEASON

Warm Spring: light gold, white gold, very shiny

•Light Spring: silver or gold, favoring gold

•Bright Spring: gold or silver, bright and polished, light, shiny, pale yellow gold

•Cool Summer: silver, platinum, matte or shiny

•Light Summer: brushed or matte gold or silver

•Soft Summer: soft metals (not shiny, bright or polished), silver, white and rose gold

•Warm Autumn: deep, warm gold, copper, bronze

•Soft Autumn: gold or silver, antique bronze, copper, brass (all soft)

•Dark Autumn: shiny, burnished or antique gold, copper, brass, bronze, pewter, and silver

•Cool Winter: shiny, polished silver, platinum

•Bright Winter: gold, vermeil (gold over silver), gold with silver together, bright rose gold

•Dark Winter: classic gold or silver, platinum, darker bronze
