Velma Dinkley is the brains of the Mystery Inc. gang. Velma asks lots of questions and finds clues in unlikely places. Velma is funny, brave and smart and has an unrequited crush on Shaggy.

Walt Warner is the Theater Manager and the theater owner. He appears torn between his current authority and his past glory days as a song and dance man. Walt loves to try on a costume to show off his variety skills.

Wilbur Warner is Walt's long lost variety partner and twin brother. Wilbur is a fabulous old-time all-rounder who cannot resist a chance to step up into the spotlight again.
