

King County Parks Metal Detector Permits

Use of Metal Detectors on any King County Park properties requires a yearly Metal Detector Permit. Permits are available through the King County Parks, Marymoor Park Office. Please read the rules and regulations before venturing out. Permit cards must be carried upon your person whenever you are engaged in the use of a metal detector or probing for buried materials on King County property.

Please read the following rules and regulations applicable to the use of a Metal Detector in King County Parks and acknowledge by signature.

Applicant must read and sign this document before permit may be processed and mailed.

1. Upon entering park property to locate buried materials, the Park Staff must be notified.
2. All digging must be done with a screwdriver or an ice pick.
3. The area will be left neat and orderly. NO holes will be left open or in a hazardous condition.
4. Permits are subject to immediate cancellation by verbal or written notification if deemed necessary by King County Parks. Duly appointed King County employees and officials are authorized to cancel and collect PERMITS for violations.
5. PERMIT CARDS must be carried upon your person whenever you are engaged in the use of a metal detector or probing for buried materials on King County property.
6. The PERMIT is for your personal use only and may not be sold, given away or utilized by any other person.
7. Park Staff or other Park Officials may restrict days and times of use and the privileges granted under the PERMIT may not be exercised when they interfere with other public or Department use of Park Property.
8. The person to whom this PERMIT is granted, designated in this document as the PERMIT HOLDER, agrees to hold King County, its agents, employees and officials harmless from all causes of action, demands and claims, including the cost of their defense, arising in favor of the PERMIT HOLDER, his/her employees, or third parties on account of personal injuries, death or damage to property arising out of the premises, or in any way resulting from the willful or negligent acts or omissions of the PERMIT HOLDER, his/her agents, employees or representatives.
