

Tiny Bunting

Cute, tiny bunting for hanging in small areas, decorating cakes, party tables or to brighten your desk.

Each pennant measures approx 2" (5.5cm) wide at the top and is 2.5" (6.5cm) deep. As pennants are threaded onto a length of bakers twine rather than being permanently stitched to a tape, you can vary the colour combinations and the length of twine they are attached to each time you use them.

Materials needed

Oddments of double knit weight yarn (each pennant uses approx 4metres (4.5 yds))
Pair of 3.25mm straight needles
Tapestry needle
Bakers twine for hanging

Abbreviations

K = knit

K2tog = knit two stitches together to make one stitch

K2togtbl = knit two stitches together through the back loops

pssso = pass the slipped stitch over

P2tog = purl two stitches together to make one stitch

sl1 = slip the next stitch from the left hand needle to the right hand needle without working it

ssk = Slip the next 2 stitches, one at a time as if to knit, to the right needle. Insert the left needle into the fronts of these two stitches and knit them together.

st(s) = stitch (es)

yo = yarn over needle to make an extra stitch

[] = work the instructions in the brackets by the number of times indicated

Instructions

Using DK yarn and 3.25mm needles, cast on 13sts.

Row 1: Knit

Row 2: Sl 1 purlwise, K1 [yo, K2tog] to last st., K1

Row 3: Sl 1 purlwise, K to end

Row 4: Sl 1 purlwise, ssk, K to end

Row 5: as Row 3

Row 6: Sl 1 purlwise, K to last 3 sts, K2tog tbl, K1

Row 7: as Row 3

Repeat Rows 4 - 7 until, you have 3 sts remaining

Next Row: Sl 1 purlwise, K2tog, pssso

Cut yarn, thread through remaining stitch and secure.

Sew in loose ends.

Weave a length of bakers twine through the eyelets in the top of each pennant and hang up your bunting
